# About the Crisis Center

Since 1979, the **Crisis Center for South Suburbia** has been dedicated to providing a **safe haven** for victims of domestic violence. Today, in addition to providing immediate safety, we offer an array of services to help victims **gain independence** and enable children to learn how to **process the violence** they have experienced in their young lives.



The Crisis Center is open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. All services to victims of domestic violence are **free and confidential**.

# Programs and Services

## housing *services*

**Emergency Shelter** and support is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

**Interim Housing** offers a longer shelter stay for those who have demonstrated motivation toward obtaining housing, but are struggling with barriers to secure housing.

**Transitional Housing** is designed to assist those who lack the resources to become financially independent and helps them gain life skills to disengage from their abusive pasts. Families can live in a community-based apartment for up to 24 months.

**Rapid Re-Housing** provides community-based apartment living to those who have a reliable monthly income. Supportive services promote healing and foster independence, and a housing subsidy gradually decreases until the client can afford to pay her/his own rent.

## victim *services*

**Counseling Services** are provided free of charge to individuals and families victimized by domestic violence.

**Court Advocacy Services** are provided by trained professionals at both the Markham and Bridgeview courthouses in order to assist with domestic violence education, securing orders of protection and providing support during the legal process.

**Chosse Your Adventure** is a collaborative employment-based program that partners with local businesses to help survivors become financially independent. The program teaches relevant job skills, offers internships and eventual job placement.

**Emergency Services** provides limited funds to help individuals and families flee from violence and move toward self-sufficiency. Examples include lock changes, hotel vouchers, transportation and utility assistance.

**Aftercare Services** are provided to ensure that adults and children continue on a successful path, free from abuse, after they transition from services.

## domestic violence outreach *services*

**Domestic Violence Hotline** volunteers are professionally trained and work 24/7 to intervene during a crisis and provide support and referrals to victims.

**Live Safe Patient Advocacy** staff conduct screenings at local hospitals and medical facilities to identify and assist those trying to break free from abuse.

**Law Enforcement and Victim Outreach (LEAV)** collaborates with local law enforcement to identify and support victims of domestic violence and provide them with the resources and support they need.

**Community Education** presentations are offered to groups and individuals looking to learn more about domestic violence and the impact on our community. ## domestic violence prevention *services*

**Safe Start** collaborates with local schools to educate young people about dating violence and encourage healthy relationships.

**Partner Abuse Intervention Program (PAIP)** is a 26-week educational group for batterers that focuses on accepting responsibility for violence in an effort to end the cycle of abuse.
