LEAV Welcomes 22nd Police Department

The Law Enforcement and Victim Outreach Program recently added another partnership with a local police department. Merrionette Park became the 22nd police department to forge a partnership with the Crisis Center. The program collaborates with local law enforcement agencies to identify and support victims of domestic violence and provide them with resources. Last year, over 4,700 follow-up calls were placed to victims after police responded to domestic disturbances and over 4,000 connections were made with victims who received support and resources.

Navigating Justice

Navigating the court system when you are a victim of domestic violence is difficult. Now try to imagine that you don't speak English so you cannot understand what's being said or what you need to do. Crisis Center Court Advocate, Esra, sees this every day at the Bridgeview courthouse, one of the two courthouses where our staff spend their days.

In their role as Court Advocates, each staff member must recognize when a victim needs help. Recently another advocate overheard a court hearing held via Zoom at the courthouse due to pandemic restrictions. What she heard prompted her to interrupt the judge and share that the client needed an Arabic translator despite the fact that she indicated she could speak and understand English. The client was then connected with Esra and immediately she breathed a sigh of relief.



Esra met Aliyah when she helped her file a police report and secure an Order of Protection. Aliyah endured physical violence, as well as emotional and financial abuse for over ten years at the hands of her husband. When he used a rope to give

each of their four children burns on their arms because they refused to stop playing and sit quietly, she knew things had to change immediately. She was tired of walking on eggshells and was fearful for her children's lives, and her own.

Aliyah did not speak English, so when she saw Esra and learned that she spoke Arabic she immediately felt safe and comforted. "Navigating through the court system is hard enough for a victim of domestic violence, but when they don't speak English, it's even more difficult. It's very confusing. They don't get the rules and steps that must be followed," Esra said. "Many victims often abandon the process out of frustration."

"Domestic violence cases are growing in epidemic proportions and cultural and language barriers often prevent victims from seeking help," Esra said. "I know that sometimes all they have to see is my hijab (a religious veil worn by Muslim women in the presence of any male outside of their immediate family, which usually covers the hair, head and chest) and they gravitate toward me for help in the courtroom."

37% of Arab women have experienced some form of domestic violence in their lifetime. Collectively, our Court Advocates speak several languages and in the past year filed 945 Orders of Protection at the Bridgeview and Markham courthouses, an increase of nearly 30% over last year. 95% of them were granted.

Filling the Void



Liane Birk's energy and kindness is contagious. Spend just a few minutes with her and you'll find yourself smiling and feeling compelled to do good for someone else. Liane and her husband, Jim, own Birk Plumbing in Alsip. "We want to

support the people in the community who give us business and there's no better way to do that than to support local charities," Liane said. "I research the charities and the business makes the financial contribution."

Over the past few years, Liane has provided a monthly meal for the shelter clients. When the pandemic prevented her from being able to cook in our kitchen, she started catering the meals. Liane also makes sure that every client in the shelter who is celebrating a birthday feels special. She provides birthday-themed paper products, decorations, cupcakes and beverages. In the past 15 months she has provided materials to decorate shelter bedroom doors when someone in the family is having a birthday.

"Doing the birthday boxes, donating meals and helping the clients feel happiness fills a void for me," she added. "I don't need anything more in my life except the feeling I get when I give back and help someone else."

Staff Retreat

Accepting Responsibility

The Partner Abuse Intervention Program is a 26-week educational group for batterers that focuses on accepting responsibility for violence in an effort to end the cycle of abuse.

Participants in the program are mandated by the court to attend class or serve jail time if they fail to attend classes.

"For many of the group participants, acknowledging their behaviors and accepting responsibility for their actions is a huge step, and not an easy one," said Lynn Langton, training manager. One of those participants was Harry.

Harry is 55-years-old, struggled with anxiety and was easily overwhelmed when speaking in front of the group. However, he often arrived to class early and talked through some issues. Narcotics, partying, and violence had been his lifestyle for decades. This also further complicated his performance in class because he was not accustomed to talking about his feelings and examining his motives.

"Blaming, minimizing, and denying was a coping mechanism in many areas of Harry's life. Taking responsibility, admitting his behavior and making commitments to end his use of violence were indicators of his therapeutic movement and increased maturity," Lynn added.

Last year, 76 batterers attended and participated in weekly PAIP groups.

"Verbally, I used every word and phrase there is; physically, I punched, kicked, choked, and threw things, including throwing my wife down the stairs. I stopped drinking, stopped the verbal abuse, and do not hit for any reason."

Finding Courage

Jerri Newman is an amazing, bright and resilient woman. As a young woman, she married a Marine whom she thought was the love of her life, but things rapidly changed. He spent lots of time drinking with friends and was rarely home. His behavior became erratic.



He threw her against the wall and almost hit her with a glass blender. He hid a loaded gun in their oven and when she turned the oven on to make dinner, the gun went off firing several rounds and nearly killing her children. Finally, she grabbed her kids and left.

They moved out-of-state, but he still tracked her down. He showed up at Christmastime asking for money, and out of fear, she gave it to him. "I didn't have a choice. He was acting crazy and I was so afraid of him," Jerri said. By this time he was selling drugs and leading a very dangerous life.

She moved back to the Chicagoland area and lived with her grandmother, who was a huge source of support. Many of her family members worked in law enforcement and soon she followed, accepting a job with the Cook County Sheriff's office working

at the county jail on 26th and California. Today, she works as a police officer with the Robbins Police Department, but her real desire is to be a domestic violence advocate and help other victims, like herself, learn that they don't have to live in fear and stay in an abusive relationship.

Jerri took our 40-hour domestic violence training course and volunteers on our hotline one day a week. "There is so much more we can do to help these women," Jerri said. "Talking about it and telling others that they don't have to stay is the best place to start."

Making Room

The need for emergency shelter often seems endless and on most days the Crisis Center's shelter is at capacity. In order to accommodate more households, we have once again shifted staff into different offices and are currently renovating the existing space to accommodate two additional households. "The changes we're making will allow us to provide shelter for 15 households," said Sarah Tygart, Director of Victim Services. "Ensuring that families have their own private space has positively impacted the healing process for our survivors."

Next Steps

The Counseling staff are launching a new group called Next Step Survivor Education. It is a psycho-educational group that teaches victims of domestic violence to recognize the early signs of domestic violence so survivors can avoid becoming engaged in another abusive relationship.

Our staff aren't the only ones who can help victims of domestic violence. If you suspect someone is in an abusive and violent relationship, you can help.

- **Help the victim make a safety plan, regardless of whether or not she/he is staying or leaving the abuser.**
- **Encourage her/him to spend time with you and other supportive friends or family.**
- **Provide her/him with resources whenever you can.**

The store is 8,600 sq. ft., of sales floorspace, which is the same size as the Worth store and 50% larger than our previous store. Donations of new or gently used seasonal clothing, shoes, purses, jewelry and decorative housewares are accepted during regular business hours: Mon, Fri & Sat 10am to 4 pm, and Tues, Wed & Thurs from 10am to 6 pm.
